Dear HEHS Students and Parents:

Welcome to our compilation of scholarship opportunities available to HEHS seniors! Between 75-100 privately-funded scholarships are advertised every year through our College/Career Resource Center (CRC-Room 132) and website. We hope this booklet will provide not only easy-to-read descriptions of these offerings, but also give both students and parents a realistic view as to exactly what is required for each separate opportunity. Please take into consideration that some scholarships may not be offered on an annual basis due to a lack of funding and website content and yearly deadlines may change.

Private scholarships begin arriving in our office in September and the actual scholarship "season" is at its height between December and April. The guide has been organized by **monthly due dates**. Scholarship opportunities will be posted for students **approximately one month in advance** of their individual due dates on the hallway wall outside the CRC. Most scholarship applications are available on line. For those scholarships applications that are not available on line, students can read the descriptions for each individual scholarship and then come into the CRC to pick up an application or instructions for acquiring applications. Simply click on Scholarship Information to view the posted scholarships and the link to the application, if available.

While many scholarships remain constant from year to year, others are disbanded and still others emerge. While **due dates** usually remain consistent, some scholarships **may change** their postmarked deadlines. Our goal, as always, is to supply you with the most current information regarding these opportunities; therefore, we are providing you with several resources to aid in your search.

Finally, while we are happy to provide this information, please be realistic and diligent in your search for scholarships and grants. More than 80% of all "gift" aid comes from individual colleges and universities and their financial aid budgets. Please check their financial aid links for information about specific scholarships for incoming freshman and/or specific majors. In addition, some of the scholarships listed in our guide require extensive documentation of family financial resources as well as student-produced essays and teacher recommendations. Students and parents should always weigh the advantages/disadvantages of each scholarship opportunity before committing to the application process.

We wish you good luck in your financial aid search and in all post-secondary endeavors.

How to Pay for College

What sources are available to help me pay for college? The main sources are grants, scholarships and workstudy programs. Most families rely on a combination of these sources.

How do I apply for financial aid? Every college and university in the United States requires that you submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA is available on the Internet at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Individual colleges may also require a separate form called the PROFILE. Some colleges use their own institutional form.

What are the main programs that could help me? There are financing programs sponsored by the United States government, the State of Illinois and individual colleges. The chart below covers the main programs. Detailed information about each of these and others is available in the HEHS College and Career Resource Center.
