The Multiple Needs program is a separatecisal education program at Hoffman Estates High School designed to meet the needsstoadents with significant communication deficits and other behaviors typically associativith the autism spectrum. The Multiple Needs program basically ctea a school-within-a-schoolThe Multiple Needs program is delivered in a specialized two-roomttime providing a predictale daily routine and environmental supports to students who dispinapaired verbal language and difficulties with social interaction.

Each course taught in the Multiple Neepfrogram is taught by a certified special education teacher with the assistance of omeone teacher's aides or paraprofessionals. The program delivers instruction covering **adut** range of regular education courses and remedial special education courses. A lsmataff-to-student-ratio allows students to receive both behavioral and academic **intentions** in a highly individualized and supportive environment. In order for the services provided in the likiple Needs Program to be effective, the student's participation and determination **ess**ential. The following behaviors increase the chances that a student will be successful:

Take part in understanding the IEParticularly the goals and objectives.

Help the teacher to identify and understance demic strengths, weaknesses and areas that need assistance.

Be prepared for classes. Have the necessaoks, pens, pencils, paper, notebooks and assignments at every class.

Go to every class every day and on time.

Ask the teacher for help, extra time, or other assistance when needed.

Inform the teacher if any academic subjectskill area is particularly difficult.

Use the learning strategies that are taught.

Communicate with teachers and teacher assistants.

Assume responsibility for his or hewn academic performance and behavior.
